Digitizing wage: We cannot pay more than \$599.99 in wages to each person for help with digitizing the collection. Mary will determine the mechanics of payment and create a time sheet for whomever we hire.

Photo Project: It was moved and seconded that Marc will appoint a leader for a photo project to create a new timeline for the town's appearance with neighborhood residents volunteering to record their parts of town.

The Newsletter is to be mailed by January 24th, based on the Town Report, and should contain a pitch for the February 2 program.

De-accession: Revisions have been made to the WHS collection policies and were presented to the Board. It was moved and approved to accept the new policy documents.

Curiosity Shop: CDs and books will be available for sale at the Cracker Barrel program, and our new accession of Grange scrapbooks should be available for inspection as well.

Preservation/Acquisition

- Examination of items in glass cases Judy and Janet opened both glass cases in the history room and examined most of the contents.
- **Scanning of fragile diaries** The Historical Society of NH will present methods for doing this scanning, and Marc will get further information about this to the Board.
